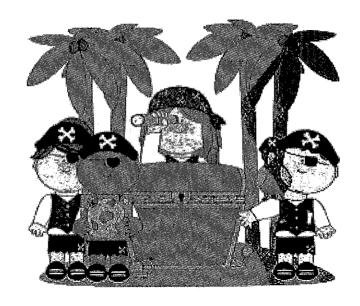

Staff will practice high visibility and wear their proper identification at all times. Classrooms have been equipped with new evacuation routes placed by all doors, telephones in every room, Instant Message on the computers, the ability to lock all doors, smoke alarms and fire extinguishers in every building. In addition, the new temporary campus has the capability to lock down in minutes with a closed gate. Red Ribbon Week activities are held annually to bring attention the dangers of drugs, alcohol and tobacco. (Drug March, Balloon Release and theme days) Disaster drills are practiced monthly and represent one of the following: evacuation, lock-down, duck and cover and campus evacuation. Demographics Strengths

DES student/teacher ratio is 14.34. (10.3 - 19) range per grade level for Kindergarten - Grade 5 for the 2016-17 school year. This is well below the state averages at every grade level except kindergarten. State level is 18.8 and local is at 19.

PreKindergarten averages are not part of the Accountability Rating system at this time.

Enrollment numbers have dropped slightly in the last 5 years.

9% of DES students are special education including speech only students which is slightly above the state average.

At-Risk students are made up of those students who have been retained and of those who are homeless. Homeless includes students whose family is doubled up and living with another family.

2016-2017 Campus Attendance Rate is currently at 95.90% with the number of students being 267 (which no longer includes 6th grade).

Historically, Prek and Kindergarten attendance percentages have always been lower than other grade levels. The Prek program being full day has helped with student attendance percentages and also with located students who would not be able to come without the 2 way transportation that is only available through a full day program.

Many families are still not able to live back in their homes yet. We are still finding things we need for our new temporary housing for the 2nd time.

All teachers are highly qualified. DES hired 3 new teachers for the 2017-2018 school year. All three newly hired teachers are graduates from DHS and call Deweyville, Texas home.

Our campus is aligned to TEKS in all subjects and all resources are based on these objectives. Teachers have access to TEKS Resource for planning and lesson purposes. All teachers turned in their scope and sequence for the year and turn in weekly lesson plans to assure they are on target in objectives taught.

Curriculum. Instruction and Assessment Weaknesses

Bench marking has been slow starting this year but we have all the DMAC tools to begin scanning and immediate data feedback on benchmarks school wide.

Family and Community Involvement

Family and Community Involvement Strengths

We have many opportunities for parents and community members to be involved in our school. (Meet the Teacher, AR Night, Math Night, Donuts with Dad and Muffins with Mom, Spooky Night at the Library, Storybook Character Day, Christmas in the Library, Track & Field Day, Book Fair and Open House) These activities are used to enable parents to help their child and to make our community and parents feel welcome at DES. We are very blessed to have the community support us and even many that are from other communities. Following both floods, we were blessed with many monetary donations from other communities and schools to help in our recovery. DES is very blessed to have a very supportive Parent & Teacher Organization also.

Family and Community Involvement Weaknesses

Often transportation is an issue for many of our low income families along with two parent working families and single parent families.

Family and Community Involvement Summary

Parent involvement is more prominant at the primary levels than the upper levels. We have newsletters every six weeks to keep parents informed of all activities and events along with the DES facebook page and new website.

School Context and Organization

School Context and Organization Strengths

All grade levels who are administered the STAAR tests have extra remediation periods each day for teachers to address student difficulties with particular objectives. This allows the teachers to ensure mastery of objectives as they are taught. Teachers are allowed to voice concerns and needs during grade level meetings, subject area meetings, and STAAR tested area meetings with the principal.

Technology

Technology Strengths

We have wireless internet school wide. We also now have ipads at each grade level. 20 ipads per teacher in grades K-5 and 30 for PreK. We also have 5-10 in each special education class. These can be used for activities tailored to each student or as a group. We have several programs to track student progress including Edmentum, Moby Max and DMAC. We are able to do benchmark testing through newly purchased printers and the DMAC program with instant feedback for teachers and administration. Most teachers have both a laptop and desk top computers with both projectors and elmos.
